## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 5072

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Assembly Bill No. 5072 with my recommendations for reconsideration.

New Jersey's wage and hour laws are crafted to ensure that covered employees are guaranteed a minimum wage and, where earned, overtime pay, and that payments of wages and earned overtime are made in a timely fashion. This bill would completely rework the enforcement procedures and remedies available for violations of the wage and hour laws. Among other changes, the bill would significantly expand criminal liability and civil and administrative sanctions for violations of these laws and mandate joint and several liability for labor contractors and client employers. It would also dramatically expand the jurisdiction of the Wage Collection Division in the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, a division that has traditionally handled smaller claims through a faster administrative procedure.

Businesses that intentionally cheat their employees out of earned compensation hurt not only their employees but also other businesses that are following the law. This conduct should be punished, and this bill contains appropriate ways to do so. However, the bill would lump all violations of the wage and hour laws together, treating paperwork errors and reasonable misinterpretations of the law the same as intentional wage theft. While I support penalizing businesses that seek to steal money from their employees, I cannot support expanding liability, especially criminal liability, to businesses that are doing their best to follow the letter of the law.

Therefore, I am recommending that the expanded liability and remedies for wage theft be limited to knowing and willful violations of the law. Doing so will ensure that aggrieved employees are properly compensated, while more draconian remedies are properly reserved for the most egregious conduct. I am also recommending removing the provision subjecting labor contractors and client employers to joint and several liability, which would allow aggrieved employees to bring actions for unpaid wages against businesses that do not actually pay them. The expanded criminal, civil, and administrative liability provided by this bill will ensure ample redress to employees against the employers that fail to properly compensate them, without subjecting businesses that are not liable for underpayments to burdensome litigation. Finally, I am recommending that jurisdiction of the Wage Collection Division be increased to \$45,000. This will allow more claims to be heard through the administrative process, while ensuring that complex matters are not only heard in more formal settings, but also processed in a way does not compromise the ability of the Wage Collection Division to timely render decisions in all matters before it.

Accordingly, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 5072 and recommend it be amended as follows:
